### BRITISH VALUES – RULE OF LAW

Here are examples of how the British Value of rule of law is taught at Sneyd Green Primary School. It is not exhaustive and does not capture all learning in this area.

YEAR GROUP	SUBJECT	CONTENT
Nursery	PSED, Golden rules, Circle time Topic 'People who help us' Summer Term	Individual lessons all year on the golden rules, what they mean and how to follow them.  Police visit to support the topic work.
Reception	PSED, Golden rules, Circle time Topic 'Jobs' Spring Term	Individual lessons in Autumn Term on golden rules. Reinforced during circle time. Reinforced by giving of themed golden tickets for following the golden rules. Visits from police, fire, paramedics support jobs topic.
Year 1	PSHE, Autumn Term	Children are taught about rules for school in general, classroom conduct and outdoor play. Reasons are given for rules, why they are important and consequences when rules are not followed or are broken.
Year 2	PSHE, Autumn and Spring Term	Children are taught about school rules and SAFE expectations. (Autumn Term) During the Spring Term, children are introduced to the idea of general laws in the United Kingdom.
Year 3	PSHE, Autumn and Spring Term	Children are taught about right and wrong in a variety of activities.
Year 4	PSHE, Autumn Term History, Spring Term	Children discuss class and school rules. Children are taught about the monarchy, hierarchy, inheritance with regard to the royal family.
Year 5	PSHE, Spring and Summer Term	Children taught to understand why laws are in place. (Spring Term) During the summer term they are taught to understand the risks of drugs and the age limits around use of drugs and other substances.
Year 6	PSHE, Autumn Term	Children are taught about who runs the country and what the government and parliament are like. They are also taught about how laws are made.
General	Assemblies Police service  Good to be green. Road safety  E safety	Assemblies revisit the theme of rule of law on a regular basis. The police service supports the work of the school and our curriculum through offering dog handling talks, police cadets (starting January 2016 in Y5), Values versus Violence curriculum materials for Y5. School SAFE expectations – school rules Road safety activities such as Bikeability, Modeshift stars team educate children on the rules of the highway and how to keep ourselves safe eg wearing seatbelts in cars. E safety lessons as part of computing and PSHE.
